



DA at the Multi Stakeholder Platform of 2030 Water Resources

Development Alternatives (DA) participated in a Consultation on the Bundelkhand Multi Stakeholder Platform (MSP) for Integrated Sustainable Water Management, organised by the 2030 Water Resources Group (2030 WRG) of the World Bank Group. The Consultation was chaired by Smt. Kumudlata Srivastava, Divisional Commissioner of Jhansi, Uttar Pradesh and was attended by the experts of Water Technology from Israel and other stakeholders. Shobhit Pratap Singh (Deputy Manager, DA), shared DA's perspectives on challenges of water security in Bundelkhand (Central India) and about the interventions in the region. 2030 WRG, a public-private-civil society collaboration hosted by the World Bank Group, facilitates open, trust-based dialogue processes to drive action on water resources reform in water stressed countries in developing economies. The ultimate aim of such reforms and actions is to close the gap between water demand and supply by the year 2030.
