

TARA organises Two-Day water quality training session in Nalagarh

Technology Action for Rural Advancement (TARA) in order to spread awareness about the fundamentals of water quality, its significance, and the key parameters that must be monitored, organised a two day training program in Nalagarah located in Himachal Pradesh.

The two-day workshop saw the presence of esteemed organisations - Parmarth Samaj Sevi Sansthan and Adarsh Sewa Samiti who joined to enrich the experience and share knowledge.

The first day of the session took place at the Conference Hall at the Kara Hotel. The five-hour session saw the participants being introduced to the workings of the Jal Tara Testing Kit - a field-based tool capable of testing 14 vital water quality parameters.

The second day of the session was an exposure visit to the Nikoowal Village in the same district, where the participants were a witness to the working water treatment system and LOCO (Locally Owned Community Operated) model in action. This visit aimed to provide a comprehensive understanding of water treatment and distribution in a real-world setting. Post the showcase of the models, interactions with the local Self-Help Groups took place in a knowledge sharing session.

The participants came out with interesting results which will help them carrying out their work in the future.

The hands-on session enlightened the participants with practical skills and knowledge about the technology that was invented to prevent any spread of water-borne diseases.
