Born to Mukesh, a diligent farmer, and a homemaker mother, Tannu is one of six siblings, comprising three sisters and two brothers. Despite her commendable achievement of passing her 12th-grade examination, Tannu was compelled to discontinue her education due to familial challenges.

For two arduous years following her departure from school, she grappled with



profound sadness, frustration, and desolation. Her predicament was exacerbated by the harsh judgment and scornful criticism from relatives, neighbors, and even some members of her own family. In the midst of this despair, she discovered the Prabhat Centre, an oasis of opportunity where she could acquire valuable professional skills and receive interview preparation assistance from dedicated mobilisers.

The prospect of regaining her independence and self-sufficiency through the training center was a beacon of hope for Tannu. She wasted no time in expressing her fervent desire to join the program. While her parents initially hesitated, Tannu was determined to convince them of the center's merits. She arranged for her father to visit the facility and discuss her aspirations with the center manager.

With unwavering commitment and the assurance of the center manager to guide her, Tannu embarked on her journey of education and skill development. She enrolled in a data entry operator course, a pivotal step towards her dream of financial independence. Even during her course, she had the opportunity to attend multiple interviews, despite facing several setbacks.

After enduring many trials and tribulations, Tannu's persistence paid off. A month after completing her course, she emerged triumphant by securing a job as a tele caller, earning a monthly income of 11,000 rupees. Today, she is a source of immense pride for her family. Among her sisters, she is the second individual, following her father and elder brother, to become gainfully employed. Not only does Tannu manage her personal expenses, but she also contributes significantly to her family's financial wellbeing.
